### **Environmental Impact:**

More than 100 different pharmaceuticals have been detected in lakes, rivers, reservoirs and streams throughout the world and have been found in drinking water supplies of at least 41 million Americans.

### **Prescription Drug Facts:**

- ~Prescription drug induced death in San Juan County, is two times the rate of other illicit drug related deaths.
- ~Prescription drug charges in San Juan County are second only to methamphetamine charges.
- ~Each year in the United States, more than 71,000 children aged 18 and younger are seen in emergency rooms for unintentional overdoses of prescription and over-the-counter drugs.
